EXAMINATION SCHEME FOR MBA (FULL TIME) 2 YEARS PROGRAM OF DEVI AHILYA UNIVERSITY, INDORE FOR AFFILIATED COLLEGES: (w.e.f. Academic year 2019-20)

(1) Semester examination Scheme:

Each paper (course) will carry 100 marks of which 20 marks shall be reserved for internal assessment and the remaining 80 marks for external examination to be held at the end of each semester as per the academic calendar notified in advance. The duration of the written examination for each paper shall be three hours.

(2) Pass Percentage scheme:

The minimum marks for passing the examination for each semester shall be 50% in aggregate and a minimum of 40% marks in each paper. Combined passing marks (External and Internal examination) are required for each paper.

(3) ATKT and Other scheme:

- I. A student will normally be permitted to clear a program within seven academic years (including the academic year of the admission) in maximum five attempts. If a candidate fails to clear the program within the above limit, Vice-Chancellor's permission, on the recommendation of the Dean, will be necessary to continue in the program.
- II. Only those students who clear the program in one attempt and without gap and grace mark will be eligible for position in the merit list.
- III. A student at a time will be allowed to carry 4 papers as ATKT. The moment the number of ATKT exceeds four, the student will reappear as a regular repeater/Ex-Student in the semester as a result of which his/her ATKT has exceeded four e.g. if the total number of ATKT of a student is four in the second semester, he/she will be promoted to third semester, if after in third semester examination, his/her ATKT is five or more, he/she shall re-appear in third semester as regular repeater/Ex student.
- IV. A regular repeater/Ex-Student may be allowed to repeat only those papers in which he/she has obtained ATKT or any number of papers that particular semester including the papers of ATKT. The candidate has to exercise the option in the beginning of the semester.
- V. If a candidate clears all the papers in a particular semester but fails in aggregate, such a candidate can reappear in any number of papers of his/her choice in that particular semester in order to up the shortfall in the aggregate. Such a student is allowed carry the semester.
- VI. Current scheme of examination and syllabus will be applicable to regular repeater/Ex-Students and to those who are appearing in examination to make up the short fall in the aggregate. If the papers of old scheme are not available in the current scheme a student will be allowed to appear in the closest equivalent papers of the current scheme in lieu of the papers in the old scheme.
- VII. Marks of internal assessment of ATKT papers and of the papers in which the student appears to make up the shortfall in aggregate will be sent to the examination section of the University afresh. The institution concerned will make the necessary arrangement for the same.
- VIII. These rules will apply for students taking admission in the academic year 2019-2020 and onwards. The old students may continue under the rules in which they were admitted.

Ordinance for Academic Degrees in foreign Trade

(FACULTY OF COMMERCE)
(Under Section 6 (9) read with Section 37(ii) of
Madhya Pradesh Vishwavidyalaya Adhiniyam, 1973

- 1 The Degrees Diplomas conferred by the University under faculty of Commerce for courses in foreign Trade shall be the following :-
- 1) Master of Foreign Trade (Two years Full Time)
- 2) Master of Foreign Trade (Three years Full Time)
- 3) Master of Foreign Trade (Five years Full Time)
- 4) Bachelor of Foreign Trade (Three years Full Time)
- 5) Diploma in Foreign Trade (One Year)
- 6) Diploma in Foreign Trade (One Year)
Finance
- 7) Diploma in International Business Laws (One Year)
- 8) Diploma in Exports (One Year)
- 9) Diploma in Import Management (One Year)
- 10) Diploma in International Logistics and Insurance (One Year)
- 11) Diploma in Computer Application to Foreign Trade (One Year)


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3. Candidates for the Master's Bachelor's Diploma Examination in Foreign Trade shall have the option of answering questions and writing the Project Report/Research Project/Factory Visit Report through the Medium of English or Hindi (Handwritten script).
4. A Candidate who passed all the courses of his/her examination will be assigned Division as per following:-
 First Division = 60% and above
 Second Division = 50% to 59.9%
 There will be no Third Division.
5. Where a candidate has to submit the Project Report/Research Project as one of the relevant semester assignments, the Project Report/Research Project shall be written under the supervision of a faculty member of the Institute in which case he may attach a certificate of satisfactory work done. In very special cases he may be permitted to submit the Project Report/Research Project under the supervision of a faculty member from industry or business house. The Research Project Report/Research Project shall be forwarded by the director to the concerned authority for signature.
6. No Private candidate will be allowed to appear in Master's Bachelor's Diploma Examinations of Foreign Trade since the courses have been designed for regular students who have undergone regular training and practical experience.


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Ordinance of B.Com and B.Sc.
ORDINANCE NO.- 17
COURSES AT UNDER GRADUATE LEVEL
(ANNUAL SYSTEM OF EXAMINATION)

(Approved by the Co-ordination committee in its 94th Meeting dt. 10/05/2018)

1. The provisions of this Ordinance shall be applicable from the date of notification of Annual system* by the state government, with effect from the academic year 2018-19.
2. The three year degree courses(e.g.- B.A.,B.Sc.,B.Com.,B.A.(H),B.Sc.(H),B.Com.(H),B.A.(Management), B.B.A.,B.C.A.,B.Sc.(Home Sc.) and any other course/courses notified for the purpose by the University / State Govt. to be run under Annual Pattern of examination (except those for which the University has separate ordinances), shall be run under Annual system.
The ordinance shall be applicable to all such courses being run in the university teaching departments (UTDs) and affiliated colleges under the jurisdiction of the University.
4. The Annual system shall also be applicable to private students.
5. The duration of these courses of study shall extend over three academic years.
6. Normally, the medium of instruction shall be Hindi / English or as decided by the University / State Govt. from time to time,
7. The intake for each of these courses shall be decided by the University / State Govt. from time to time, as the case may be.

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


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3. Every candidate seeking admission to these courses shall be required to have passed 10+2 examination (Higher Secondary) of N.P Board / CBSE. Any other equivalent body recognized by the University for this purpose.
Provided that , for the purpose of admission in Honours courses the min. marks required shall be 60 % or as notified by the University / State Government from time to time .
9. Admissions in these courses will be made by any mode and procedure, as decided by the state government for colleges and in case of the UTTDs as decided by the university, from time to time.
10. Admission rules and Guidelines, as framed by the state Govt./University shall be applicable for admissions from time to time.
11. The Under Graduate courses in Annual System shall consist of:-
 a. Such Subjects, Supervision, Internship, Lab works, Practicals, etc. as may be prescribed by the University/ State Government from time to time.
 b. Such Syllabus and the Scheme of examination as may be prescribed by the State Government or University, as the case may be, from time to time.
12. Each student shall have to appear separately in the examination of theory/practical and continuous comprehensive examination (CCE) internal assessment(IA), if he/she is eligible and has not otherwise been prevented by the University from appearing in the examination. The CCE /IA will be held in the manner prescribed from time to time by the University/State Govt
13. For passing the examination, the candidate shall be required to secure minimum marks (As prescribed in the relevant scheme) in

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
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- the University examination separately in Theory, Practical(s) if any and CCE/IA shall be included in prescribed subject.
14. There shall be supplementary examination for the eligible candidates. Theory, Practical and CCE/IA shall be treated as separate subjects for this purpose.
- (i) If a candidate fails in one subject in the supplementary examination, all the remaining subjects of that examination, he/she will be allowed to appear in the supplementary examination for two consecutive chances only. Provided that if a candidate fails in more than one subject in any examination, he/she shall be declared FAIL and allowed to appear in the next examination of the same class.
- Provided also, that if a candidate is unable to clear the supplementary examination in the chances prescribed in sub para (i) he/she shall be declared fail and shall have to appear in all the papers of the said examination again.
- (ii) The candidate shall be awarded degree only in the year when he/she clears all the papers.
- (iii) In all the above cases, the candidate shall be required to appear in the examination as per the syllabus and scheme applicable at the time of examination.
- (iv) Any changes notified any time by the state Govt. in the criteria of eligibility of supplementary examination, shall overrule the above provisions.
15. No candidate shall be allowed to appear in the Examination unless he/she has:
- Attended at least 75% of lecture/practical delivered separately (For Regular candidates only)
 - Paid all the fees due.


Ordinance 44-B

Indore Institute of Management & Research, Annual System

Ordinance No. 44-B dated 1st January, 2023, in accordance with the National Education Policy 2020.

This ordinance is issued in accordance with the National Education Policy 2020, which mandates the transition from the semester system to the annual system. This ordinance aims to implement the annual system across all undergraduate programs at Indore Institute of Management & Research. The annual system will commence from the academic year 2023-24. The following changes will be implemented:

- The academic year will be divided into two semesters, each lasting six months.
- Exams will be conducted at the end of each semester.
- Grades will be awarded based on cumulative performance throughout the year.
- Students will receive feedback and guidance on a regular basis through continuous assessment.
- The curriculum will be revised to include practical projects and industry-based learning.
- The teaching methodology will focus on experiential learning and critical thinking.
- The faculty will undergo training to adapt to the new teaching methods.



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


PT-101 C PRINCIPLES AND PRACTICE OF MANAGEMENT

COURSE OBJECTIVE

The course is aimed at delivering an insight into the field of management. The course aims at explaining various concepts of management and contemporary management practices, highlighting the functions and responsibilities of the manager, making the students aware about professional challenges faced by the managers and acquainting the students with the tools and techniques that are used for handling the challenges of managerial jobs along with an understanding of the work environment.

EXAMINATION SCHEME

Student shall be evaluated on two components; 20 internal and 80 end semester examination. There will be 20 marks for internal evaluation, three internal evaluations will be conducted one of which two will be written test and third will be assignment/ presentation/quiz/ class participation. Best two out of 3 evaluation will be considered as internal marks.

The semester examination carrying 80 marks will have two sections A and B. Section A worth 70 marks will have six theory questions out of which students will be required to attempt any four questions. Section B carrying 20 marks will contain one or more cases (or cross-functional).

Note: Relevant Case Studies (at least two cases per unit) will be discussed compulsorily.

COURSE OUTCOMES

After studying the course, the students would be able to gain:

- CO-1: Understanding of various management concepts functions and practices
- CO-2: Understanding of the role of managers
- CO-3: Learn about integrating management practices in work environment
- CO-4: Enhance their decision-making through the use of analytical skills of management.

FT-104 CIT & E-BUSINESS FUNDAMENTALS

COURSE OBJECTIVES

The objective of this course is to help the student acquire the basic knowledge of Information Technology and e-Business Fundamentals. The subject course is to help students to understand the management aspect of E-commerce Technological Environment.

EXAMINATION SCHEME

Student shall be evaluated on two components: 20 internal and 80 end semester examination. There will be 20 marks for internal evaluation, three internal evaluations will be conducted out of which two will be written test and third will be assignment/ presentation/quiz/ class participation. Best two out of 3 evaluation will be considered as internal marks.

The semester examination carrying 80 marks will have 30 marks for viva-voce, 50 marks for written examination that will have theory and practical problems. 7 to 8 questions will be asked out of which students will be required to attempt any 5 questions.

COURSE OUTCOMES

After the completion of the course the students should be able

CO1: To understand basics of Information Technology and E-Business fundamentals.

CO2: To gain knowledge of Computer fundamentals and applications of MS-Office in business.

CO3: To have awareness of E-business, Cyber security threats & other related issues.

CO4: To Learn optimum uses of e-resources like websites, search engines, shopping sites, etc.

COURSE CONTENTS

UNIT I

Introduction to Computer: Hardware, Input / output devices, storage devices and memory. Software, System and Application Software, Compilers, Interpreters and Assemblers. Computer Languages, Levels of languages, generation and their features. Internet: Concepts & Services, Hardware and software requirements, type of Internet connections, Operating Systems: WINDOWS XP, Basic Operations, utilities and features.

UNIT II

Application Software (MS-Office)

Dr. Veena Dadwani, Director and Career Counsellor, conducted a session on "The Art of Communication". She spoke about the importance of communication and its impact on others.


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
Mr. Vicky Kushwaha, Librarian, gave a library orientation. He spoke about the facilities available in the library, including the digital library, journal and library rules.

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
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Frequency and Varieties of Assessment


MBA curriculum prescribes at least three internal evaluations, out of which two are written tests and third shall be Assignment/Presentation/Quiz/Class Participation. Best two out of three evaluations are considered for final marks. In Undergraduate program, Academic calendar issued by DHE forms the basis of academic planning. Accordingly, two internal evaluations in the form of written tests are conducted in UG programs. Besides MST exams, one quiz, one group presentation and minimum one application based assignment/ projects are conducted. Teachers have all the freedom to use other assessment tools like class participation, class tests, and group discussions, viva voce for continuous evaluation.

If the student is dissatisfied with the marks obtained and the redressal provided by the subject faculty, the student can approach the MST coordinator, for his/her redressal.


In case both the above steps are not addressing the issue faced by the student, the said student can consult with their concerned HoD. The decision of the HoD will be final and abiding.
